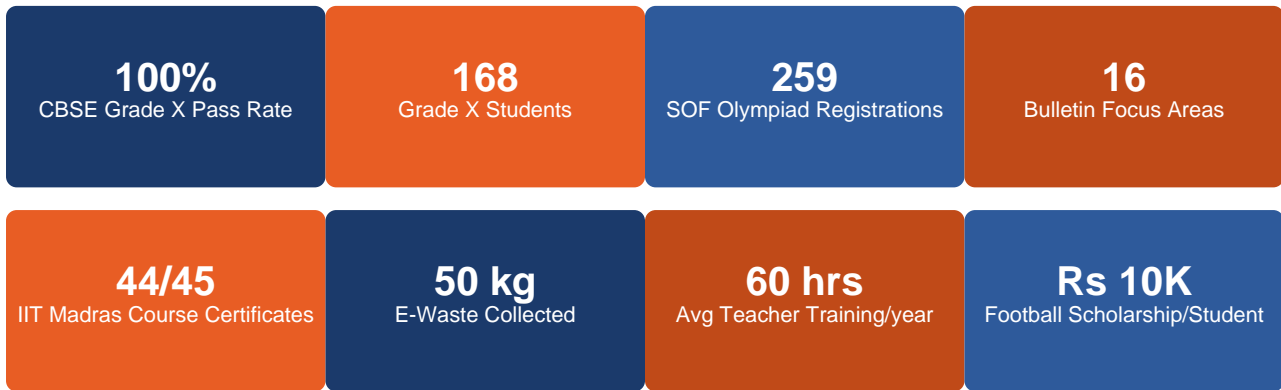

- Focused on indigenous materials, renewable energy, rural entrepreneurship, and Make in India by reducing dependence on imported fuels.

Project 2: Samridh Bharat – Sustainability Hub Website

- Proposed a digital platform to identify, mentor, and support Indian innovators who lack resources.
- Platform components included Talent Hub, Awareness Hub, Campaign Hub, Sustainable Market, and Inspirational Hub.
- The idea focused on multilingual access, inclusion, and data privacy.

- **CBSE Grade X Board Examination:** 168 students appeared and KARV achieved a **100% pass rate**.

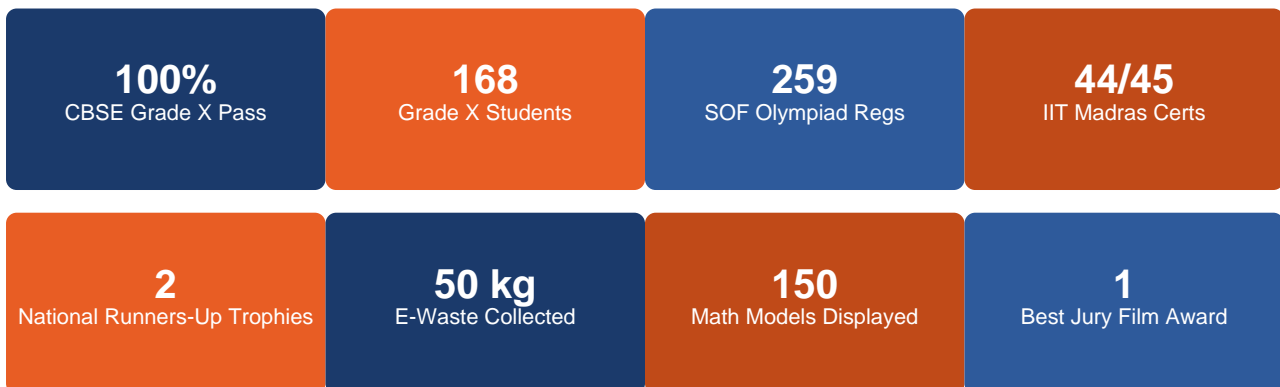
● Sports Achievements
